knowledge to our District," Commissioner Joe Perry said. "We look forward to working with him for many years to come."



During the spring and summer, water usage increases exponentially. But saving water is easy with a few small changes that will not only conserve Long Island's only water source aquifer, but lower your water bill as well.

Small Steps, Ble Returns

"Although we encourage >> SAVE ALL VEAR our residents to practice conservation all year long, our peak season, May through September, is when we need to be aware of our water usage the most," Commissioner Ciro DePalo said. "By working together we can ensure that

our water source is being protected and that water is available for any emergencies should they arise.

- 1. Use EPA WaterSense labeled products like toilets, shower heads and faucets.
- 2. Shorten your showers, which can use 6.5 gallons of water per
- 3. Fix leaks that have the potential to waste gallons of water, even tiny

>> SUMMER SAVINGS

- 1. Smart irrigation controllers and rain sensors ensure your lawn only gets watered when needed
- 2. Check hose connections for leaks and fix leaky spigots.
- 3. Lawns only need 11/2 inches of water per week, so they should not be watered daily.
- 4. Keep plants moist with mulch, which also prevents run-off and controls weeds.
- 5. Consider making your own rain barrel and collect water for your plants.

Remember to Follow the Mandatory **Odd/Even Lawn Watering Restrictions**

When: Effective May 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023:

- Even-numbered houses may water ONLY on even-numbered calendar
- Odd-numbered houses may water ONLY on odd-numbered calendar
- Houses without numbers may water ONLY on odd-numbered calendar days.

Please notify your irrigation contractors and landscapers to set watering times to the odd/even schedule.




